I enjoy reading the local bi-weekly "Fishwrapper" newspaper. It's an uplifting, old-fashioned, Christian -based collection of touching stories; dumb (but funny) jokes; silly anecdotes; helpful hints; and Pennsylvania Dutch recipes.

In the June 4, 2019 edition, there was a (possibly apocryphal) story called "Eight Hundred Pacos," which resonated so greatly, I wanted to reprint it here:

"There's a Spanish story of a father and son who had become estranged. The son ran away, and the father set off to find him. He searched for months to no avail. Finally, in a last desperate effort to find him, the father put an ad in a Madrid newspaper. The ad read:

Dear Paco, Meet me in front of this newspaper office at noon on Saturday. All is forgiven. I love you.

On Saturday, **eight-hundred** Pacos showed up looking for forgiveness and love from their fathers."

Every one of us needs and longs to be forgiven our sins, errors, and transgressions, whether or not we realize it. Each of us is a "Paco" looking for love and reconciliation with our Heavenly Father, and that is why God sent Jesus to live among us, and die on our behalf.



Jesus also taught that just as *He* forgives us, *we* are to forgive others (Matthew 6:14). That's often easier said than done, and may take more time than we're willing to give the process.

One reason Christ taught us to pray "forgive us our debtors," is that forgiveness is essentially releasing another person from a debt (such as: money, justice, kindness, etc.) we feel they owe us. We have to *let go, and let God*. It's been said that "forgiveness doesn't change the other person's life, it just keeps unforgiveness from destroying ours." There's a lot of truth to that adage.

As we enter into Autumn, and prepare to say goodbye to another year, even though this is not a "penitential" season in the Church, I think it's a good time to thank God for His mercy in forgiving us, and to ask Him for the grace and patience to forgive all who have offended, wronged, or hurt us.

As we celebrate our 290<sup>th</sup> year in ministry for Christ at St. John's Church, we've been reviewing the complicated early history of our parish that began as a British church. In our members' backgrounds, we have found both Tories and Colonists; loyalists and revolutionaries; slaveholders and abolitionists. The United States managed to make peace with England, and later, North and South were reconciled.

With the help of God's grace, let us do the same with our fellow men and women.





# Parish Cookbooks !


