"Since, then, you have been raised with Christ, set your hearts on things above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things above, not on earthly things. For you died, and your life is now hidden with Christ in God."

These verses from Colossians 3:1-3 describe the "**Doctrine of Identification**." St. Paul taught that whoever believes in the Gospel, God *identifies* that person with Christ in His life, death, resurrection, and ascension.

In the New Testament, there are hundreds of references to the **believer's union with Christ**. For example, believers are *created* in Christ (Eph. 2:10); crucified with Him (Gal. 2:20); buried with Him (Col. 2:12); baptized into Christ and His death (Rom. 6:3); united with Jesus in His resurrection (Rom. 6:5); and seated with Him in the heavenly places (Eph. 2:6). Christ is formed in believers (Gal. 4:19) and dwells in our hearts (Eph. 3:17); Jesus is

in us (2 Cor. 13:5) and we are in *Him* (1 Cor. 1:30; Phil. 3:8–9).

Our Spring Bible Study class has undertaken an intensive study of Colossians. When recently we discussed Chapter 3, the Holy Spirit showed me that although we Christians talk about being "in Christ"; ask "What would Jesus do?"; and even piously claim, "All things belong to Him," what if we looked at our identification with Jesus differently? For instance:

If we are *truly* in union with Christ, then the cell phone I use is *Jesus*' phone. The laptop I access is *Jesus*' computer. The TV I watch, the meal I fix, and the bed in which I sleep are *His*.



So that invites the question: If it's *Jesus*' phone, am I using it to call up and yell at someone? If it's *Jesus*' computer, am I logging onto immoral websites? If it's

Jesus' TV, am I watching shows or movies filled with cruelty, evil, violence, and perversion? If it's Jesus' meal, am I eating food that is unhealthy? And am I doing things in Jesus' bed that are contrary to the will of God?

If we made the effort to live our lives each day fully identified with Christ Jesus, this perspective would radically change our discipleship! Of course, we'd 'flunk the test' repeatedly. But what if we at least *tried* to see everything in ourselves and in our lives as *Christ's*?

An old hymn contains the words:

So near, so very near to God,
I cannot nearer be.
For in the person of His Son,
I am as near as He.
So dear, so very dear to God,
I cannot dearer be.
The love with which He loves
His son—such is His love for me.

This summer, may you know the deep, deep love of Jesus; be assured that your life is "hidden" [kept safe] in Him, both now and eternally; and receive the grace to seek that which is Christ's alone.
